JUSTICE TEACHING INSTITUTE

Florida Supreme Court Justice R. Fred Lewis returns to the Fifth Judicial Circuit on Monday, April 13, 2009 to participate as faculty at the Annual Justice Teaching Institute being held this year at the Hernando County Courthouse. Along with Justice Lewis' case study presentation, attendees will be welcomed by Fifth Judicial Circuit Chief Judge Daniel B. Merritt, Sr., followed by the Importance of an Independent Judiciary, by Circuit Judge Stephen O. Rushing, an Overview of the Criminal and Civil Trial Courts by Ashley Aulls, Esq. and Frank Miller, Esq., and a presentation on the Mechanics of a Trial, by County Judge Donald E. Scaglione. The one-day Institute will include a courthouse tour.

The Justice Teaching Institute is presented by the Fifth Judicial Circuit, the Hernando County Bar Association, and the Hernando County Public Schools. The Institute's goals are to educate teachers so they can better understand the courts and bring that knowledge gained to the classroom. This year's Institute will give 16 attendees a unique opportunity to hear from a justice of the Florida Supreme Court.
