**ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER REGARDING COSTS  
IN TRAFFIC CASES**

**WHEREAS**, Rule 6.470(b), Florida Rules of Traffic Court, has been amended as of January 1, 1993 to allow, by Administrative Order, the imposition of costs in civil traffic cases in which no hearing is required; and

**WHEREAS**, the Clerk of the Circuit Court is desirous of establishing consistency in costs associated with civil traffic infractions;

**NOW THEREFORE, it is ORDERED as follows:**

1. When no hearing is required or held, and the offender either admits the commission of the offense by forfeiting a bond, pays the penalty, or receives a withheld adjudication pursuant to the provisions of Sections 318.14(9) and (10), Florida Statutes, a court cost shall be assessed per violation as follows:

a. Five dollars (\$5.00) for each violation of pedestrian regulations under Section 316.130, Florida Statutes; and for each violation of Chapter 316, Florida Statutes, by a bicyclist 14 years of age or under.

b. Ten dollars (\$10.00) for all non-moving traffic violations; and

c. Fifteen dollars (\$15.00) for all moving traffic violations.


d. Two dollars (\$2.00) local law enforcement education.

2. The above referenced cost is established by this Administrative Order and is permitted pursuant to Rule 6.470(b), Florida Rules of Traffic Court.

3. The sums collected shall be remitted to the Clerk of the Circuit Court as reimbursement for expenses in administering traffic regulations.

4. The effective date of this Administrative Order shall be October 1, 1996.
