CITRUS, HERNANDO AND SUMTER COUNTIES:

- 1. The Honorable William H. Hallman, III, Circuit Judge in Sumter County, is currently appointed and shall continue to preside over evidentiary hearings and determine all motions to exceed the fee limit filed pursuant to Section 27.5304, Florida Statutes for cases pending in the Tri-County.
- 2. Effective July 1, 2021, the duty, responsibilities and provisions of this Order shall transfer to Hernando County and more specifically, the Administrative Judge of Hernando County, or their designee, is hereby appointed to preside over evidentiary hearings and determine all motions to exceed the fee limit filed pursuant to Section 27.5304, Florida Statutes for cases pending in the Tri-County.
- 3. Effective July, 1, 2022 the duty, responsibilities and provisions of this Order shall transfer to Citrus County and more specifically, the Administrative Judge of Citrus County, or their designee, is hereby appointed to preside over evidentiary hearings and determine all motions to exceed the fee limit filed pursuant to Section 27.5304, Florida Statutes for cases pending in the Tri-County.
- 4. Thereafter, the duties defined herein as they relate to the Tri-County shall rotate to the administrative judge or his or her designee each July 1st as follows:

Effective July 1, 2021, the duty, responsibilities and provisions of this Order shall transfer to Lake County and more specifically, the Administrative Judge of Lake County, or their designee, is hereby appointed to preside over evidentiary hearings and determine all motions to exceed the fee limit filed pursuant to Section 27. 5304, Florida Statutes for cases pending in Lake and Marion Counties.
- 7. Thereafter, the duties defined herein as they relate Lake and Marion Counties shall rotate to the administrative judge or his or her designee each July 1st as follows:
