ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER NO. A-2023-13

RE: ALTERNATIVE SANCTIONS FOR TECHNICAL VIOLATIONS OF JUVENILE PROBATION AND CONDITIONAL RELEASE SUPERVISION

WHEREAS, Chapter 985, Florida Statutes, was enacted with the intent, in part, to divert children from the traditional juvenile justice system and to provide alternatives to institutionalization; and,

WHEREAS, §985.435(4), Florida Statutes, allows a probation program to include alternative sanctions for children who are in violation of certain technical condition(s) of his or her probation, but who have not committed any new violations of law; and,

WHEREAS, §985.46, Florida Statutes, allows for supervision of children on conditional release supervision after release from residential commitment, and in recognition that children commit technical violation(s) of conditional release supervision, and may benefit from alternative sanctions if transfer pursuant to §985.441(4) is not deemed necessary; and,

WHEREAS, the use of alternative sanctions in its juvenile probation program and conditional release supervision serves the families of the Fifth Judicial Circuit by providing, alternatively, swift and appropriate consequences for certain technical violations without requiring an actual formal violation of juvenile probation proceeding; and,

WHEREAS, a juvenile probation program which includes an alternative sanctions component must detail in the disposition order which specific technical violations are subject to alternative sanctions, which alternative sanctions may apply; and,

WHEREAS, the statewide Graduated Response Matrix attached hereto is a useful tool in determining the availability of alternative sanctions and incentives to move the child toward compliant behavior,

including specific alternative sanctions for specific technical violations of the conditions of probation or conditional release supervision, and may in the discretion of the Court be utilized in specific situations by the Department of Juvenile Justice (DJJ) or its designee; and,

WHEREAS, a child who complies with the terms and conditions of probation or conditional release supervision benefits from non-monetary incentives to motivate the child to continue compliant behavior; and,

WHEREAS, Article V, § 2(d), Florida Constitution and § 43.26, Florida Statutes charges the Chief Judge with the authority to promote the prompt and efficient administration of justice in the courts over which he or she is Chief Judge;

IT IS THEREFORE

ORDERED and ADJUDGED administratively as follows:

- 1. Each disposition order of probation and/or post commitment probation, and each order imposing conditional release following residential commitment, entered in a juvenile case shall make alternative sanctions as determined through use of the Graduated Response Matrix as a judicial option to address certain technical violations. Incentive options as attached hereto shall also be available to juvenile probation officers for use to encourage compliant behavior.
- 2. Each dispositional order of probation and/or post commitment probation and order imposing conditional release in a juvenile case shall include the following language:

In response to any noncompliance with the technical conditions in this disposition order, the Florida Department of Juvenile Justice may impose alternative consequences commensurate with the seriousness and frequency of noncompliance. Violations of certain probation or conditional release technical conditions may be addressed by the Department of Juvenile Justice in accordance with the attached Graduated

Response Matrix and shall be based upon the child's assessed risk level. The child is advised that the Department of Juvenile Justice may impose these consequences for such technical violations without further order of the Court.

The Department of Juvenile Justice shall file an affidavit alleging a violation of any condition of probation not included in the attached Graduated Response Matrix, and the Department may file an affidavit alleging a violation of any condition of probation even if the violation is specified in the attached Graduated Response Matrix. The department shall file an Affidavit for Violation of Probation with the court if the youth refuses or fails to comply with the alternative consequences. The department may proceed with a transfer pursuant to §985.441(4) at any time for a child on conditional release.

In the event a violation is alleged but no petition alleging violation is filed, the Department of Juvenile Justice shall file with the Court a Notice of Technical Violation and Intent to Impose Alternative Sanctions with copy to the presiding judge.

The Department is authorized to utilize the attached Incentive Options for a child who is compliant with the terms and conditions of probation or conditional release. If the child subsequently becomes noncompliant with the terms and conditions of probation or conditional release, the Department may impose alternative consequences as set forth in the attached Graduated Response Matrix or may file an affidavit for violation of probation or transfer as permitted under §985.441(4).

- 3. Nothing in this order or the language to be included in each of the orders referenced in Paragraph 2 above shall act in any way to divest the presiding judge of discretion to require a formal violation of probation proceeding and to reject any alternative sanctions noticed as intended to be imposed, regardless of the alternative sanction option appearance or availability upon the Graduated Response Matrix.
- 4. This order supersedes Administrative Order Number A-2021-37.
- 5. This order and the provisions herein are effective May 1, 2023.
