- 3. The Estate is hereby administratively closed until the resolution of the civil matter. The Personal Representative is not discharged and is hereby authorized and ordered to retain all fiduciary and other powers that are necessary to enable, on behalf of the Estate and its beneficiaries, to take any legal action and execute any documents that are necessary to facilitate and assist in the resolution of the estate.
- 4. The Personal Representative shall continue to remain obligated pursuant to the Oath of Personal Representative and shall continue to remain empowered pursuant to the Order Appointing Personal Representative and the Letters of Administration in order to facilitate his/her ability to carry out fiduciary duties as Personal Representative of the Estate, and for purpose of taking any appropriate action, make any necessary decisions, and execute and necessary documents related to the resolution of the estate.
- 5. Following the resolution of the pending matters, the Personal Representative shall petition to reopen the Estate for the purpose of filing the Petition for Discharge and other pleadings required to formally close this Estate.
