Please note:

Process Service Memorandum and a certified copy of the Motion for Civil Contempt/Enforcement must be personally served by a sheriff or private process server to the other party(ies) in the case. When proof of service has been filed in the case contact **Family Court Case Management** at **352-742-4301** to be set for a hearing.

***If the Department of Revenue is a party to the case, you may need to schedule your hearing time with the Department of Revenue.
